Our warmest welcome to the 5th International Young Astronomers School on the "Scientific Exploitation of the Gaia data".


In the following, you can find some practical information regarding your stay, as well as on the organization of the Hands-on Sessions from Monday to Thursday afternoons. This practical information booklet is also available on the School webpages, in pdf format.

Lectures

Please note that all lectures, lunches and hands-on sessions will take place at the FIAP (30 Rue Cabanis, 75014 Paris).

Morning lectures, from Monday to Friday, will take place in the Lisbonne room, floor -1, from 9h00 to 12h30. Coffee breaks are planned every morning from 11h00 to 11h30, just outside the Lisbonne room.



Afternoon HO-sessions will take place in the rooms Lisbonne, Athènes, Budapest and Copenhague from 14h00 to 18h30. For the HO-sessions, each participant is associated to a group. To know the group you are associated to, how groups are redistributed over the HO-sessions during the week, and a plan of the different rooms, please refer to Page 5 of this booklet. Coffee breaks are scheduled every afternoon from 16h00 to 16h30, just in front of the Lisbonne room.

Sunday afternoon, and Monday early morning: Registration

Registration will take place in the main hall of the FIAP on Sunday afternoon from 16h00 to 20h00, and before the beginning of the first session, on Monday morning, from 8h15 to 8h45, at the entrance of the lecture room ('Lisbonne' room).

Sunday afternoon : Welcome buffet

An informal welcome buffet will be organized on Sunday from 18h00 to 18h45 in the main hall, at the entrance of the FIAP, for those of you that will be already at FIAP at that time.

Sunday/Friday : Check-in/Check-out at FIAP

For those of you who chose an accommodation at FIAP, check-in/check-out must be done directly at the reception desk of FIAP, which is open 24 hours a day. Rooms at FIAP will be available from 14h30, on Sunday. Check-out on Friday must be done before the morning lectures. Luggages can be left at the reception desk.

from Monday to Friday : **Breakfasts**

For those who have chosen an accommodation at FIAP, breakfasts will take place at the self-service, ground floor, starting from 7h00. They are included in your registration fees.

from Monday to Friday : Lunches

Lunches will take place at the self-service, ground floor, from 12h30 to 14h00. Tickets for lunch will be given to you, every day, at the registration desk. Lunches are included in your registration fees.

from Sunday to Friday : **Dinners**

They are not included in your registration fee, and you are free to go wherever you prefer. Some options are listed here :

- The areas of Place Denfert Rochereau / rue Daguerre, and the Butte aux Cailles, respectively at the north-west and south-east of FIAP, are both within walking distance, and offers plenty of possibilities, from cafes and brasseries, to crêperies, Chinese, Thai and Indian food.
- You can also walk or take public transports to reach the Quartier Latin, in the 5th district, which is a vibrant area, known for its universities and students life. Plenty of possibilities also there, from cheese fondue restaurants along the Rue Mouffetard, to couscous and tajines at the restaurant of the Mosquée de Paris, to some Tibetan restaurants around the Rue Saint Jacques, to the typical French bistrot Les Pipos, just in front of the Ecole Polytechnique.
- If you want to leave the left bank of the Seine, many possibilities for dinner or simply for a drink can also be found on the Right Bank : in the Marais district, or around Place de la Bastille (Rue de la Roquette) and Rue Oberkampf, just to cite a few.
- you can have dinner at FIAP, if you prefer not to go outside, at the cafe in the main hall or at the self-service. For additional information and opening hours, ask at the FIAP desk.

In all cases, take into account that eating in Paris may be relatively expensive, from ~20€ for cheap brasseries and cafes, up to 40€ and more for the most expensive places cited here - beverages excluded. Always check prices and opening hours before going, and take also into account that many restaurants offer daily menus at special prices.

Thursday evening : Cocktail at Paris Observatory

A cocktail will take place at the Salle Cassini of the Paris Observatory on Thursday evening, starting at 19h00. Paris Observatory is within walking distance (about 15 mins) from the FIAP. The entrance of the observatory is at the address : 77, Avenue Denfert-Rochereau, 75014 Paris. At the entrance, for security reasons, you will be asked to give your name, and your bag can be checked. The Salle Cassini is located at the first floor of the Bâtiment Perrault (Building #1 in the map at the end of this booklet).

WIFI connection

A free wifi connection is available at FIAP in all rooms and common areas. The network is wifiap. There is no password.

Food and Smoking

Note that you are not allowed to bring any food neither in the lecture rooms, neither in your personal rooms. All rooms are no-smoking.




Here the redistribution of the afternoon HO-sessions among the different rooms.
